


#### Walt Disney Family Museum San Francisco, California

To celebrate the 100th anniversary of the founding of The Walt Disney Company, The Walt Disney Family Museum will be showcasing rare and unique objects from the museum's collection, which highlight important milestones in Walt's career and his company's early history. These artifacts, which include recent acquisitions and fragile materials that have never been publicly displayed, will be on view for free in the museum's Awards Lobby and will rotate periodically throughout the next year.

In July 1923, Walt Disney's initial foray into film production ended in disappointment with the collapse of the Laugh-O-gram Films studio. However, before the studio filed for bankruptcy, Walt, Ub Iwerks and his team had been able to complete production of *Alice's Wonderland* – which would later become the pilot cartoon for the Alice Comedies series, combining a live-action young actress with animated backgrounds and characters.

With the encouragement of his older brother Roy, and with the pilot reel in hand, Walt sold his film camera and put the money towards

a one-way, first-class train ticket to Los Angeles, California. After arriving in "Hollywood," he set about finding a distributor for the Alice Comedies. Just a few months later, Walt and Roy went into business with M.J. Winkler Productions, the company of pioneering film producer Margaret J. Winkler, to develop a new series of short



films featuring the live-action Alice and her adventures in the animated world of "Cartoonland." The contract with Winkler Productions marked the founding of the Disney Brothers Cartoon Studio, which we know today as The Walt Disney Company, on October 16, 1923.

Beginning Thursday, October 19, the first object the museum will place on temporary display is an original letter Walt penned to Mrs. T.J. Davis, dated October 16, 1923—the same day he and Roy signed the distribution contract with Winkler Productions. Davis was the mother of Virginia Davis, the first child actor to portray the titular character in the Alice Comedies series.

In negotiating their agreement, Winkler specified that she wanted the same actress to portray Alice in subsequent installments of the Alice Comedies series. As a result, Walt implored Davis to allow her daughter to star in the series, praising Virginia's talent and vouching for Winkler's ability to promote the shorts. Virginia's parents soon agreed to move the family to California, and she became the studio's highest-paid employee at the time. While a facsimile of this letter is exhibited in the museum's main galleries, the original document has previously never been on public view due to its highly fragile nature.

The museum continues to host Disney *Cats & Dogs*, a traveling exhibition originally presented in 2021 by the Walt Disney Animation

Research Library, Walt Disney Archives, and Disney Japan at Matsuya Ginza – the historic department store in Tokyo – before traveling to additional destinations in Japan. In conjunction with this year's celebration of The Walt Disney Company's 100th anniversary, this unique and exciting exhibition is now on view for the first time in the United States in the museum's Diane Disney Miller Exhibition Hall.

Due to its popularity, the museum recently announced that the run of Disney Cats & Dogs has been extended through June 2, 2024. For more information contact (415) 345-6800.

#### White Horse Black Mountain Black Mountain, North Carolina

Nestled in the picturesque town of Black Mountain, North Carolina, White Horse Black Mountain is not just a venue; it is a haven for music enthusiasts and a thriving center for community connections with a vision for the future. The listening room began in November 2008 and celebrated its 15th Anniversary on November 4 with a concert featuring a line-up of seven artists. White Horse has survived recessions, pandemics and remains resolute in their determination to serve the local, regional and global community through the power of live music.

The community venue became a non-profit in April 2023 and has plenty of exciting updates planned for this historic space in 2024. With the addition of a rooftop deck, a full kitchen and a jazz bar with wine tasting room expansion, the organization has big plans for the future and looks forward to improving what has served as the "living room" of Black Mountain for the last 15 years.

#### Toronto

Scotiabank Arena has revealed details of a multimillion-dollar face-lift ahead of the venue's 25th anniversary. The multi-phased renovation represents the arena's largest changes for the facility since its opening in 1999. 

# Historic Rabbit Run Theater Madison, Ohio

Historic Rabbit Run Theater, with its quaint and rustic surroundings, has been an entertainment mainstay in northeast Ohio for generations. Its charm and pastoral setting irresistibly draw patrons each summer from the end of May through the end of August.

Rabbit Run is located in the heart of the Grand River Valley Wine District near the shores of Lake Erie in picturesque Madison, Ohio, and is one of the few original barn theaters still in operation. 

#### Gallup, New Mexico



The rich history of patriotism in Gallup is a major point of pride for Gallupians. Many of the Navajo Code Talkers who bravely served in World War II are from the Gallup region. Korean War veteran and Congressional Medal of Honor recipient Hiroshi "Hershey" Miyamura was also from Gallup and is memorialized on murals, installations and buildings across the community.

The Gallup Cultural Center, 201 E. Historic Route 66, is a great location to learn more about why Gallup is America's Most Patriotic Small Town. Even if you are not




Be sure to also check out the Rex Museum, also on Historic Route 66, for a deeper dive into the past and how it has shaped modern life. This building also fea-

# Tri-State Museum & Visitor Center Belle Fourche, South Dakota


Smack-dab in the middle of the United States is Belle Fourche, South Dakota – and

Significant exhibits include photos and information on Belle Fourche WWII hero Don Smith, one of the pilots in the Doolittle Raid. The museum also includes the less than heroic story of the most bungled bank robbery ever, which occurred in 1897 and involved an extremely inebriated Tom O'Day.

In addition to permanent collections, the museum also features three temporary exhibits and three mini exhibits which change throughout the year. Exhibits for the 2024 season include those on clubs and societies, menus, the police force, maps, libraries, fairy houses and the world of bats.

The town of Belle Fourche is a little one big in history. The name comes from the river that flows here, visited by the famed French fur trappers of the early 1800s. The town itself was founded by Seth Bullock, a larger-than-life western character who was featured in the TV series, *Deadwood*. It soon became the

place for the internationally-known Black Hills Roundup, now in its 104rd year of showcasing classic rodeo action.

The Old West lives on in the middle - and at the Tri-State Museum and Visitor Center.



For more eclectic shopping and eateries, groups head 15 minutes east to Shepherdstown, the oldest town in West Virginia. Groups visiting Shepherdstown find that hospitality is the only thing more alive than the local arts scene.

It is easy to make a group tour historical in Berkeley County. Historic sites like Morgan Cabin – the home of the area's first white settlers; General Adam Stephen House – the founder of Martinsburg and The George Washington Heritage Trail pull history from the past and into today. George Washington's outdoor bathtub in nearby Berkeley Springs.


#### Georgetown Loop Railroad Georgetown, Colorado

The Georgetown Loop Railroad was one of Colorado's first visitor attractions. Completed in 1884, this spectacular stretch of three-foot narrow-gauge railroad was considered a marvel for its time.

The then-thriving mining towns of Georgetown and Silver Plume lie two miles apart in a steep, narrow mountain canyon. To connect them, the railroad's builder designed a "corkscrew" route that traveled twice the distance, slowly gaining more than 600 feet in elevation. The Colorado & Southern Railway operated the line for passengers and freight from 1899 to 1938 when it was abandoned.

In 1973, the Colorado Historical Society began restoring the railroad as part of its 978-acre Georgetown Loop Historic Mining & Railroad Park. A replica of the high bridge was completed in 1984 in time to celebrate the 100th anniversary of its original construction.

Open air train rides of one hour and 15 minutes or train rides are available seven days a week, five trains daily April through January. Train rides with a mine tour of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours are available seven days a week, four trains daily from the end of April through October. You can enjoy gold panning with any mine tour. The train ride is wheelchair

accessible; the mine tour is not and involves walking a steep slope. Steam trains will operate from early May to October.

There are several Special Events trains including Bunny Trains, Mother's and Father's Day Weekend Trains with treats for Mon and Dad, Sasquatch Adventure Trains weekends in July, Old West Days Trains weekends in August with reenactors of a railroad gang, Grandparent's Weekend in September, Fall Colors weekend and weekdays in late September and early October, Pumpkin fest trains first weekend in October with Pumpkins for the kids, Autumn fest second and third weekends in October, Trick or Treat Trains last weekend in October, Santa Trains and Lighted Forest Trains mid-November through December 24 and Victorian Holiday Trains December 26 through the first weekend in January. Holiday trains run daily and during the night from November through the second week of January. All special events trains include a collectable poker chip. Holiday trains include a yearly Loop Commemorative Ornament.

The Georgetown Loop Railroad is located 45 miles west of Denver on Interstate 70, exit 228; 646 Loop Drive, Georgetown, Colorado or the Silver Plume Depot just off exit 226.





#### Stuhr Museum Grand Island, Nebraska

Stuhr Museum, located in Grand Island, Nebraska, is a captivating destination that brings the past to life, offering visitors a unique and immersive experience into the history of the people who called the Platte River Valley home. 





#### **Smithsonian National Air** & Space Museum Chantilly, Virginia

"Wow!" That is what most people say when they first glimpse the exhibits at the National Air and Space Museum's Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center in Chantilly, Virginia.

Located next to Washington Dulles International Airport, the Udvar-Hazy Center is a "must see" for anyone traveling to the DC/northern Virginia area. The center includes a massive aviation hangar (three football fields in length) and a space hangar that is large enough to hold a Space Shuttle and so much more.

The center displays more than 3,000 artifacts, including nearly 200 aircraft, sharing the story of human flight from 18th century ballooning to the cutting-edge James Webb Space Telescope. This includes Space Shuttle Discovery, an SR-71 Blackbird, an Air France Concorde, a World War I-era Sopwith Camel, the B-29 Superfortress Enola Gay and more.

The 90-minute public tours run throughout the day and may also be reserved for groups of 20 or more (10 or more for 60-minute student group tours). Volunteer docents take visitors on a guided journey through the museum's vast



his winter Conway Scenic's Snow Train enters its fifth operating season. Snow Train offers visitors to New Hampshire's Mount Washington Valley a classic train ride through a winter wonderland that also provides an alternative way to reach the popular Attitash Mountain Resort. Snow Train 2024 will begin operation on December 26, 2023 and will offer weekend and holiday excursions from North Conway to Attitash through the end of February. On the days of operation, Conway Scenic Railroad offers four Snow Train departures from its classic Victorian-era North Conway Station. Passengers have the option of traveling out and back to Attitash on the same run or to lay over at Attitash between runs and enjoy winter sporting and cultural activities at the Attitash Mountain Resort.

## Building on the Historic Legacy of Boston & Maine's Snow Train

Snow Train has a long history in the White Mountains. A century ago, the Boston


& Maine Railroad identified winter sports as a growing source of traffic for passengers traveling from southern New England to northern New Hampshire. By the mid-1920s, the railroad was marketing their trains as an ideal way to reach hotels and resorts in the White Mountains. Then, during the early years of the Great Depression the railroad invented *Snow Train* as a means to further boost its seasonal traffic and make weekend use of trains that otherwise would be sitting idle.

With this in mind B&M helped develop the weekend ski industry by operating specially scheduled *Snow Trains* directly from Boston, Rockport and Worcester, Massachusetts, to allow visitors to take day trips or weekend overnights to enjoy, 'Fast Trails – Gentle Slopes – Fun for All' in North Conway and other areas of New Hampshire's White Mountains. For two decades B&M's *Snow Train* flourished and helped plant the seeds of New Hampshire's winter

sport industry. However, after World War II, improved highways, increased automobile ownership and a general decline of privately-operated New England railroads, resulted in diminishing interest in rail travel. The historic B&M *Snow Train* made its final runs in the 1950s.

## In 2020, Conway Scenic Reinvents Snow Train

Conway Scenic Railroad assumed operation of the northern six miles of Boston & Maine's Conway Branch in 1974, and began operating summer and autumn excursions on August 4 that year. The railroad expanded in the mid-1990s, when its assumed operation of the long-dormant Mountain Division from North Conway through Bartlett and over Crawford Notch, now the route of its popular *Mountaineer* that runs May through November. In 2020, under the direction of Dave Swirk, Conway Scenic Railroad re-introduced the *Snow Train* concept. While it was no longer possible





to run long-distance rail services from Boston to North Conway because key connecting lines had been abandoned decades ago, Conway Scenic Railroad devised its *Snow Train* as a means of using the Mountain Division to connect its North Conway Station with the winter playgrounds at Attitash.

Rather than simply run one or two excursions per day, the railroad implemented an intensive schedule to allow for multiple departures plus the option for an Attitash layover. The blossoming success of this concept allowed *Snow Train* to grow over the last few seasons. Conway Scenic's 2024 season (started December 26, 2023)

will offer increased seating capacity, including more premium dome seating, and ushers in partnership with Attitash Mountain Resort to give *Snow Train* riders a choice of Attitash activities. To further the *Snow Train* concept the railroad hopes to offer group bus tours from Portland, Maine to bring passengers to North Conway to enjoy a trip on the *Snow Train* and a visit to Attitash. # New York City Congestion Pricing

ince many readers of Bus Tours Magazine either currently operate tours into New York City or are planning to do so in the future, we thought it might be a good idea to give you a "heads up" that a new congestion pricing toll for Manhattan could go into effect as early as spring of 2024. While the program has been approved, it is going through a review process and could easily be modified or delayed. Hence, those who are running bus tours into New York, or planning to do so, should watch closely to see how things develop. The following information is current through late December but could easily be changed as things develop.

#### **Background**

While similar congestion pricing programs are already in place in London, Stockholm and Milan, this would be the first such program in the United States. The original concept dates back to pre-pandemic days but became more popular lately. There is increasing concern over congestion and pollution in Manhattan's Central Business District while the MTA has been suffering from reduced ridership and income since the pandemic. Hence, the new congestion pricing program would charge a toll to vehicles entering the Central Business District to reduce congestion and pollution while then using that money to support the MTA's bus and rapid transit operations.

The Transportation Mobility Review Board was charged with developing rates and regulations for congestion pricing. They issued their recommended tolling structure



on November 30, 2023, which then went to the MTA for approval. On December 6, 2023, the MTA board approved the rates and regulations suggested by the Transportation Mobility Review Board. Only one of the 10 MTA board members opposed the plan. He said, "\$24 – that is what it will be to go in and see a son or daughter, or to see a show or have dinner. I cannot vote for it I am sorry to say."

At this point the program goes into a 60-day response period which will include four public hearings in late February and early March. It is possible that the new tolls could go into effect as early as late spring. However, there are several government bodies and groups opposed to the plan as well as individual groups seeking exemptions for taxis and buses. Hence, there is a possibility that the program could be delayed or the rates and procedures changed.

#### Area Involved

The area involved with the new congestion pricing tolls is in Manhattan and is being called the Central Business District. On the north it starts at 60th Street, which is effectively the south end of Central Park, and then continues south to the south tip of Manhattan at the Battery and boat docks.

There are two exceptions: the Franklin D. Roosevelt Drive on the east side of Manhattan adjacent to the East River and the West Side Highway on the west side of Manhattan adjacent to the Hudson River. Presumably, these exemptions would allow drivers to come in to Manhattan in a tunnel or on a bridge, circle the extreme edge of the island and leave in another tunnel or on a bridge without having to pay a toll.

Some people not familiar with New York City have asked whether it is possible to do a bus tour of New York without entering this area. The answer is a pretty strong "No." While Central Park and a few attractions are north of this area, the majority of key attractions are located south of 60th Street. These would include the 9/11 Memorial, the Empire State Building, Chinatown, the Flatiron Building, Rockefeller Center, Radio City Music Hall, Times Square and numerous others. It is possible to get a ferry to the Statue of Liberty from the New Jersey shore.

#### Tolls

Regular daytime toll rates would be in effect from 5 a.m. to 9 p.m. on weekdays and from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on weekends. At other times is was suggested that tolls should be reduced by about 75 percent.

Daytime tolls for automobiles would be \$15, but this fee is charged only once each day. Drivers who already pay a toll to use one of the tunnels to reach Manhattan would get "crossing credits" that would reduce their congestion pricing fee.

#### Feature: Congestion Pricing

The only buses exempt are city transit buses and commuter buses. All other buses would pay a toll. The rate would be \$24 for intercity and charter buses but \$36 for tour buses. I am not sure how the overhead scanners would know the difference.

#### How to Pay

While there may be additional ways to pay, it is presumed that the majority of the congestion tolls would be collected by overhead scanners reading E-Z Pass devices mounted in the vehicles. Overhead scanners are already being erected south of 60th Street. For those who do not know, the E-Z Pass is very popular in the Eastern states and elsewhere for collecting tolls for a tollway, bridge or tunnel. Those buses already going into New York are probably already carrying an E-Z Pass device.

There are other systems that will work with E-Z Pass. I have driven buses into the Northeast states and find that our Illinois

I-Pass will also work. You can check to see if other systems are compatible.

#### Opposition

While proponents of the congestion pricing plan suggest it could go into effect as early as late spring of 2024, it is facing a response period with substantial opposition and requested changes. Hence, it is possible that the congestion pricing implementation will be delayed or modified.

The biggest opposition is coming from government agencies. The State of New Jersey leads this group and has apparently already filed a lawsuit. New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy points out that New Jersey drivers would be badly hurt and would get nothing in return since the MTA rapid transit lines do not serve New Jersey. Opposition is also coming from the borough of Staten Island that has no direct road, tunnel or rapid transit connection with Man-

hattan. It is the most isolated and car dependent of the five boroughs.

In addition, there are organizations supporting various driving groups. Current proposed regulations would not exempt school buses, and there is a move to do that. In fact, some of the bus people would like to exempt all buses since they reduce pollution and congestion. Some people are also trying to exempt taxis since they perform a public service and their ridership has not returned to pre-pandemic levels. Of course, there are also those who object to the toll money going to the MTA. Many of the drivers say that they are forced to drive because of a lack of suitable public transportation.

Again, we need to watch and wait to see what happens. Meanwhile, we hope that this information has helped Bus Tours Magazine readers. We will try to update it in future issues.
