

George Bush Presidential Library & Museum

West College Station, Texas

The George Bush Presidential Library & Museum is ready for an exciting fall. Educational opportunities to learners of all ages are provided. From new curricula for school groups to exciting community programs to engaging exhibits, there is always something new to see and learn at the Bush Library & Museum.

In addition to the permanent exhibition galleries, the museum features temporary exhibits on a variety of topics, providing repeat guests a new experience every time.

The Spirit of the Place exhibit is open through March 30, 2025, in the Ansary Gallery of American History. This exhibit explores the path that led President Bush to choose Texas A&M to be the home of his Presidential Center. Additionally, *The Spirit of the Place* offers information on the many ways that George and Barbara Bush supported the

community that embraced them with open arms. Using artifacts, documents, photographs and other materials, visitors get a never-before-seen look at George Bush's vision for creating a world-class cultural institution dedicated to public service right in the heart of Texas. Experience the legacy that President Bush has left through his Presidential Center, discover its role in the community and its impact on the world, and see how that ongoing legacy is intertwined with the Spirit of Aggieland.

Serving America and President Bush: The U.S. Foreign Service is on exhibit in the Fidelity Gallery through February 2, 2025. This exhibit commemorates the centennial of the founding of the U.S. Foreign Service – the career diplomats who advise the President on international affairs and advance the nation's interests serving in 165 foreign countries. The exhibit tells the story of the origin, development and contributions of the Foreign Service since 1924.

Texas Ranger Hall of Fame & Museum Waco, Texas

"One riot, one ranger," is a phrase made famous by Texas Ranger Captain W.J. McDonald in the very early 1900s. McDonald was called upon by a mayor to stop a forbidden prize fight and ease an angry mob. When stepping off the train by himself, the puzzled mayor asked, "Where are the others?" To that McDonald replied, "Hell, ain't I enough? There's only one riot, isn't there?"

It was the reputation of McDonald and early Texas Rangers that personified an icon of rugged individualism, courage, honesty

and virtue. They have created an image that criminals fear and children idolize.


The legendary Texas Rangers are the oldest state law enforcement agency. They celebrated their 200th anniversary in 2023. Tracing its lineage back to 1823, Rangers have served through three centuries under five flags – Mexico, the Republic of Texas, the State of Texas, Confederate Texas and the U.S. again.


The official Texas Ranger Hall of Fame & Museum is conveniently located off Interstate 35 at the Brazos River in Waco, Texas. Visitors learn about the history of the Texas Rangers through exhibits, which include badges, firearms, photographs and other artifacts on display. In addition, children will enjoy a bandit hunt. The Texas Rangers, with their cowboy hats and silver stars on their shirt pockets, remain an important part of our heritage.

Sponsored by the City of Waco, more than four million persons have visited its museum, hall of fame, research library, Ranger head-quarters building and banquet facilities. *Texas Highways* magazine readers ranked it one of the Best Texas Museums, *USA Today* called it one of the nation's outstanding Halls of Fame, and *True West Magazine* titled it the Best Western History Museum in Texas.

The museum is open Monday through Sunday 9 a.m.-5 p.m. with group rates available. Guided tours can be booked at least two weeks in advance of arrival with staff availability. For more information, phone (254) 750-8631 or visit TexasRanger.org.







Martinsburg-Berkely County West Virginia




Are you feeling peckish after shopping? Groups find a selection of tasty eats at Martinsburg's locally-owned restaurants. Choose between world cuisines or go straight to dessert. Visiting DeFluri's Fine Chocolates and Everything Cheesecake will satisfy anyone's sweet tooth.

For more eclectic shopping and eateries, groups head 15 minutes east to Shepherdstown, the oldest town in West Virginia. Groups visiting Shepherdstown find that hospitality is the only thing more alive than the local arts scene.

It is easy to make a group tour historical in Berkeley County. Historic sites like Morgan Cabin – the home of the area's first white settlers; General Adam Stephen House - the founder of Martinsburg and The George Washington Heritage Trail pull history from the past and into today. Groups can even see George Washington's outdoor bathtub in nearby Berkeley Springs. There is an ample amount of Civil War sites, as well. Groups can visit the Martinsburg B&O Roundhouse to see the place once destroyed by Stonewall Jackson's troops in 1861. Men, of course, are not the only participants in the war. Check out the Berkeley County Museum, located in the home of Confederate spy Belle Boyd, at the aptly named Belle Boyd House.

Bush Family Home State Historic Site Midland, Texas

Two presidents, a first lady and two governors lived here. While George H.W. and Barbara Bush resided in this home with their young family, two of their children were born, and one of them died.

It was a remarkable time in the lives of a consequential American family.

The Bush Family Home State Historic Site is unlike any other in the THC's collection of 38 properties. It is a different kind of historic – only a generation removed from many visitors' lives. The home is filled with familiar touches, like Pyrex kitchen bowls, a yellow Cub Scout neckerchief and even a television in the living room.

"A lot of people say the home reminds them of their mom or grandma's house – I love to hear things like that. People have a real tangible connection to this home," says Site Manager Troy Gray, noting that the Bush family lived in the house from 1951-55.

One of the site's highlights is George W's room. Metal roller skates, a Little League glove and adventure books humanize the

former president by showcasing his child-hood years as a typical American kid with recognizable toys and interests. Another room is dedicated to baseball, which played a significant role in George W's life.

Now that the THC has officially acquired the Bush Family Home, Gray is optimistic about future goals and plans for the site. He notes that thanks to assistance from the Friends of the Texas Historical Commission and THC Chairman John L. Nau, III, two adjacent properties were purchased to develop additional exhibit space dedicated to the family.

With new exhibit space years down the road, Gray is currently focusing on updating and expanding the scope of stories told at the home. Future interpretation will include information about the importance of volunteer work in Barbara Bush's life along with additional displays about the family's other children.

Gray says he also hopes to dedicate exhibit space to people who played important roles in the family's lives, including household staff. He envisions displays focusing on Civil Rights and the inequitable treatment of the people of color who worked in the home.





The gift shop is stock full of iconic merchandise including stylish apparel, tote bags and a small library's worth of fascinating literature.







In the Village, visitors can see where the children live, go to school and play. Trees, open spaces, statues, and fountains create a picturesque, small-town setting for America's hurting children.

Celebrate 150 Years of Mountain Railroad in New Hampshire

In summer 2025, New Hampshire's Conway Scenic Railroad will celebrate the 150th anniversary of the famous Mountain Division over Crawford Notch - a rocky pass named for pioneer settler Able Crawford. This spectacular railroad was completed over Crawford Notch in 1875 and remains one of the most scenic lines in New England. Conway Scenic has operated excursions over Crawford Notch since 1995. Today it is the route of the Mountaineer, which recreates the experience of a 1950's transcontinental streamlined passenger train. This offers three classes of travel in a variety of different cars. The ever-popular, stainless-steel Budd Vista domes provide a premium class experience with elevated panoramic views. To help mark the anniversary of the Mountain Division,



the railroad has added extra trains to its summer schedule.

Conway Scenic Railroad is based at the iconic 1874-built North Conway Station. Designed in a Russian revivalist style by Boston architect Nathaniel Bradlee, this unique railroad structure is a treasure of the Victorian era. Among the daily trains from this beautifully-restored station is the *Valley Train* that all summer long makes several daily trips down the Saco River Valley on the

historic Conway Branch to Conway, New Hampshire, treating visitors to the experience of traveling from town to town by rail on authentic vintage rail passenger cars. Among the most popular is antique open-platform observation car *Gertrude Emma*, built by the Pullman Company in 1898.

Since 1974, Conway Scenic Railroad has been a chief attraction in New Hampshire's Mount Washington Valley located in the heart of the White Mountains. Relax on board the train and take in a rolling panorama. The combination of classic mid-20th railroading with pastoral mountain environment, characterized by rocky peaks, forests and the winding Saco River offers visitors a trip back in time. Conway Scenic is a real railroad, its lines located in the mountains when the train was the most efficient means of land travel. Check out conwayscenic.com for more information.
