#### News and notes for bus tour planners

#### Arlington's National Medal of Honor Museum Arlington, Texas

The National Medal of Honor Museum Foundation broke ground on the future museum on March 26. Former President George W. Bush, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff General Mark Milley and Medal of Honor recipient Major General Patrick Henry Brady were on hand for remarks.

"When you look at the Medal of Honor recipient, you are looking at someone who has demonstrated gallantry under impossible odds, you are looking at someone who has placed duty above self, you are looking at someone who understands the meaning of sacrifice in the most profound way," former President Bush said at the groundbreaking ceremony. "During these turbulent times people ask me, am I worried, and my answer is no. I'm optimistic about the future so long as we emulate the virtue and the character of the people we honor, we're gonna be just fine."

"We will soon have this Medal of Honor Museum deep in the heart of Texas," Chairman Milley said. "By shining a spotlight on the Medal of Honor recipient that received it, the values they lived for, and in many cases died for; visitors will come to understand the meaning and price of freedom."

The one-of-a-kind museum is in recognition of the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest award for valor in combat beyond the call of duty. The museum will stand in affirmation of the values of the Medal of Honor and its 3,511 brave recipients since the Civil War, of whom only 66 are living today. Designed by world-renowned architect Rafael Viñoly, it will sit amidst a five-acre landscape adjacent to major attractions like



Six Flags Over Texas, AT&T Stadium, Globe Life Field and Esports Stadium Arlington. The 101,000-square-foot footprint will encompass 25,000 square feet of exhibition galleries, a state-of-the-art Education Center, conference and event space, and an outdoor amphitheater for ceremonies.

The National Medal of Honor Museum is set to open in 2024.

#### National Comedy Center Jamestown, New York

As the world remembered the late comedy legend Carl Reiner on his 100th birthday recently, the National Comedy Center – the United States' official cultural institution dedicated to the art form of comedy, and the home of Reiner's career archive– continues digitizing and preserving rare documents, scripts and artifacts spanning Reiner's extraordinary career in preparation for its new, multi-media exhibit: *Carl Reiner: Keep Laughing*, debuting on July 1, 2022.

The new exhibit will showcase hundreds of never-before-seen archival materials

spanning Reiner's remarkable seven decades as a writer, director, producer, author and performer. Visitors will explore interactive stations that feature rare audiovisual clips, creative papers, photographs and dimensional artifacts that intimately chronicle a lifetime of creative output: from Reiner's early years as a performer on Sid Caesar's legendary Your Show of Shows to his creation of the seminal The Dick Van Dyke Show, from his collaboration with Mel Brooks on the Grammy-winning 2000 Year Old Man to his acclaimed cinematic partnership with Steve Martin (The Jerk, All of Me and more), and across his far-reaching contributions to the comedic art form. The exhibit will run throughout 2022 and

On the occasion of Reiner's 100th birthday, the National Comedy Center released images of select artifacts and documents which will be on display in the exhibit, including Reiner's typewriter case and original, typed manuscript for the first episode of *Head of the Family* – which would become the leg-

endary *The Dick Van Dyke Show*; rare photos of Reiner with Mel Brooks, Sid Caesar and Imogene Coca, and with Dick Van Dyke and Mary Tyler Moore; the cowboy hat that Reiner wore in the final episode of *The Dick Van Dyke Show*; and a manila envelope with Reiner's New Rochelle, NY address on Bonnie Meadow Road (just one number off from Rob Petrie's address in The Dick Van Dyke Show) in which he kept early short stories, and more.

With a multi-faceted career spanning television, film, stage, record albums, books and even social media, Reiner, who passed away in June of 2020, was a 12-time Emmy® award-winner, a Grammy® award-winner and a recipient of The Kennedy Center's Mark Twain Prize for American Humor. # New and Renewed Cultural Gems Throughout San Diego San Diego, California

#### Art With a View

In April 2022, the Museum of Contemporary Art San Diego (MCASD) debuted the long-awaited renovation and expansion of its La Jolla flagship campus. The museums will feature four times the previous gallery space, two levels of light-filled galleries, a

public park and new seaside terraces, allowing visitors the opportunity to both relax and reflect. In addition, guests will be able to enjoy some 200 works of contemporary art with views of the Pacific Ocean serving as an inspiring backdrop. The first exhibition museumgoers will experience is that of artist Niki de Saint Phalle's innovative work from the 1960s. The exhibition will be the first to focus on the artist's experimental and prolific work

during this decade, from her famous "shooting paintings," created by shots from a .22 caliber rifle, to the exuberant sculptures of women known as "Nanas."

#### Under the Shell

The Rady Shell at Jacobs Park, which opened as the first bayside concert venue in the nation in August 2021, provides not only state-of-the art acoustics and architecture but also stunning views of the waterfront and downtown San Diego's cityscape. The new concert hall without walls serves as a summer home to the San Diego Symphony and entertainment space to other performers throughout the year. Tickets are now on sale for an impressive lineup of artists from the San Diego Symphony to performers like Lea Salonga, Olivia Rodrigo, Leon Bridges, Little Dragon and Ben Platt.

#### **Breaking New Sound**

San Diego visitors will have another opportunity to experience the magic of the San Diego Symphony, but in a revitalized historical setting. The Jacobs Music Center is undergoing a major renovation that will

transform its Copley Symphony Hall in downtown San Diego. The project will include the reconfiguration of the stage; the addition of a choral terrace behind the orchestra; new finishes and seating; state-of-the-art lighting, sound and video equipment and superior acoustics. The renewed and improved Jacobs Music Center is scheduled to open in fall of 2023.

#### Art of the People

After a three-year renovation, Mingei International Museum opened to the public in September 2021 with a reimagined space and a renewed commitment to the idea of community, culture and creativity. Located in Balboa Park, the museum, which is housed in a Spanish Colonial Revival building constructed for the 1915 Panama-California Exposition, highlights how everyday objects and materials that serve a useful purpose can also be objects of great beauty. Its admission-free commons level, patio, amphitheater, library and large exhibition space filled with folk art, aims to be accessible so people everywhere can engage with its mission.

#### **Geek Out Year Round**

Comic-Con fans do not have to squeeze all their excitement and celebration into a four-day convention. The Comic-Con Museum in Balboa Park now allows pop-culture enthusiasts the chance to engage with its comic-inspired content year-round. Museumgoers can expect 25,000 square feet dedicated to rotating exhibits; a 6,000-square-foot education center; a 4K video theater and presentation space; a gift

shop filled with comics, graphic novels and branded souvenirs; learning-focused labs, classes and seminars. Comic-Con also plans to continue to expand its interior display space and educational area over the next several months leading to a grand opening of the three-floor museum in July 2022.

#### **Intimate Art**

The Timken Museum of Art, which is set to open in the first half of 2022, has spent the last two years renovating itself so that it honors the museum's historic architecture and mission while improving the visitor experience. Called Balboa Park's "jewel box," the Timken Museum, is a treasure of mid-century architecture filled with European and American masterpieces, including the only Rembrandt publicly on display in San Diego, as well as European art icons. The museum's minute size is by no means a minus. Instead it makes for an art-viewing experience that is both intimate and accessible, allowing visitors to relax and absorb what is considered one of the finest small museums in the world. Admission is always free.

#### Old Town Smethport Opens Smethport, Pennsylvania

Step back in time. Nestled in the hills of northwestern Pennsylvania, Smethport offers a glimpse of its pioneer past to visitors at the newly-opened Old Town Smethport. Within this one building, your group

can explore the historic displays, shop at the General Store and then enjoy a delightful meal at the Cottage House Restaurant & Winery.

Old Town Smethport was created to highlight segments of Smethport's remarkable history. Smethport went from a pioneer town, to become the hub of commerce for lumber barons, bankers and oil men during the 1800s. This history is reflected in the beauty of the mansions built along Main Street during the 1800s and early 1900s. Exhibits at Old Town

Smethport include a passenger stagecoach, a Civil War cannon, a General Store delivery truck, an antique horse saddle, a life-size log cabin and a working general store. These are just a part of the displays you will see as you stroll inside along a pathway designed with life-size trees, a cloud-covered painted sky overhead and a wide selection of displays honoring Smethport's history.

The General Store in Old Time Smethport is constructed to replicate an authentic old time general store. As you walk across the wooden porch to enter the store, you will see an antique Texaco sign hanging overhead. The shop offers a collection of nostalgic gifts and hand-crafted, locally made treasures. The cash register on the counter is more than 100 years old and is from an original shop in Smethport. Smethport has a history of making folks happy. Smethport Specialty Toys is where one of the most influential toys of the 20th century, Wooly Willy was invented and manufactured. Invented in 1955 by James Reese Herzog, the original Wooly Willy, with his magnetic personality, allowed you to draw whiskers, hair and eyebrows with your magnetic wand on Willy's bald head. Old Town Smethport has a display of the historic toys created and manufactured by Smethport Specialty Toys.

During the Civil War, General Thomas L. Kane mustered recruits on the steps of the McKean County Courthouse, a local recruit saw a deer hanging at a butcher shop nearby and he cut off the deer's tail and affixed it to his hat. This group of First Pennsylvania Rifles, gained the nickname of "The Bucktails." The Bucktails became renowned for their skill as sharpshooters. Also, on display is a Civil War three-inch cannon with a limber. According to the display text, "The three-inch cannon was the most widely used Union gun during the war. Invented by John Griffin, it was extremely durable, with the barrel made of wrought iron primarily produced by the Phoenix Iron Company of Phoenixville, Pennsylvania. The cannon had exceptional accuracy." The limber, the cart designed to carry the ammunition and support the cannon allowing it to be pulled by horses, is also on display.

Old Town Smethport currently has original displays crafted at American's First Christmas Store; they are in the process of recreating an updated version of America's First Christmas Store within their location. The new shop will honor the artwork and holiday specialties originally sold in 1932 and feature new holiday selections for the modern home. America's First Christmas Store was originally opened in 1932 by Leonard Johnson after his gold rush adventure out West was unsuccessful. A druggist by trade, he opened a corner store with two store fronts. One store front was a drug store, the other sold handmade Christmas displays. By 1935, his Christmas displays were nationally known, and his store became a shopping destination. People from all over the world drove to Smethport to visit his store. The shop was open for MORE THAN 70 years. Today, Johnson's historic Christmas displays are sought after antiques.

The restaurant at Old Time Smethport, the new Cottage House Restaurant & Winer,y is open for both lunch and dinner. Group menus

are available. They can also arrange a dessert and specialty cocktail menu as a treat for your group after their visit to the nearby Kinzua Sky Walk.

The Kinzua Sky Walk is "one of the top 10 most scenic skywalks in the word," according to The Culture Trip, U.K. It is located at the Kinzua Bridge State Park at 296 Viaduct Drive, Mt. Jewett, Pennsylvania. Admission is free. The skywalk extends 624 feet into the Kinzua Gorge at a height of 225 feet. The park offers a selection of free educational programs for motorcoach groups. Old Town Smethport is located at 113 West Water Street, Smethport, Pennsylvania. It is housed in an historic building, which was once a lumber mill, close to Hamlin Lake. It is open Tuesday to Saturday, 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. Admission is free. The restaurant is open the same hours as are the displays and General Store. #### Tudor Place Historic House & Garden Washington, D.C.

Tudor Place Historic House & Garden reopened Thursdays through Sundays beginning March 4 with a return to docent-led guided tours of the historic house. Advance registration is suggested for timed entry tickets. Docent-led tours start on the hour, with the last tour beginning at 3 p.m.

Visitors also may enjoy the garden during their visit and are encouraged to bring a picnic and bask in the beauty of this space. The Web site tudorplace.org provides information and resources for visitors, including registration for timed entry tickets.

A model of Federal-period architecture in the nation's capital, Tudor Place shares the stories of multiple generations of Martha Washington's descendants and the enslaved workers and servants

who lived and worked here. With more than 18,000 objects, including the largest Washington collection outside of Mount Vernon, Tudor Place sits on  $5\frac{1}{2}$  acres in the heart of Georgetown.

Ticket reservations and health and safety guidelines are listed at tudorplace.org/visit/plan-your-visit-2. Visitors to the historic house 12 years of age and older will be required to provide proof of vaccination upon entry, and masks are required in all indoor spaces.

Tudor Place preserves the stories of six generations of descendants of Martha Washington, and the enslaved and free people who lived and worked at this Georgetown landmark for nearly two centuries. By examining their legacy, our visitors are challenged to celebrate the triumphs and to confront the complexities of the past.

#### **East Troy Railroad Museum**

The East Troy Railroad Museum, doing business as the East Troy Electric Railroad, is celebrating 50 years of running tourist trains and trolleys this year. The regular season started the weekend of April 23-24 and runs through October.

Fifty years is quite an accomplishment for a volunteer-run organization that is keeping history alive on the last remaining segment of The Milwaukee Electric Railway & Light Company (TMER&L) track. At one time the TMER&L system had more than 200 miles of track stretching north, south, west and southwest from the Public Service Building in Milwaukee.



#### Vue Orleans New Orleans, Louisiana

New Orleans' newest attraction, Vue Orleans, is officially open and features the city's first 360-degree view of the Mississippi River and the New Orleans landscape. This breathtaking panorama is not

reserved just for geography – exhibits and interactive experiences also give visitors a robust view back in time, covering 300 years of history and the diverse people and groups that created the city's unique culture and continue to shape it today.

Vue Orleans is a one-of-a-kind observatory and exhibit located at the foot of Canal Street in the newly-renovated Four Seasons highrise building. Touchless interactive exhibits feature legendary New Orleans figures, such as the Soul Queen of New Orleans, Irma Thomas; Preservation Hall Jazz Band and even more of the city's famed culture bearers.

"For years we've been gathering stories from local historians, artists, musicians, Mardi Gras Indians, and chefs, leaders of business and leaders second lines, all with the goal to curate a state-of-the-art cultural experience and share the real story of New Orleans – what it was, what it is and what it all means," said Paul Flower, developer of Vue Orleans. "Vue Orleans is a fresh look at one of the world's most historic and beloved cities and we are proud to finally unveil this unique experience."

Before stepping into the Vue Orleans entrance, guests begin an immersive journey by entering through a towering display at the foot of Canal Street highlighting the individuals that create the vibrant daily life of New Orleans. Ground-floor exhibits feature a visual explosion of local artwork and the opportunity to interact with personalities pulled straight from the pages of history books – including Henriette De Lisle, a free woman of color, activist and nun; Giacomo Cusimano, Italian immigrant and pasta maker; and Tillie Karnofsky, Jewish immigrant and early supporter of Louis Armstrong – all brought to life by actors on life-sized touchscreens.

#### **Additional Experiences**

- Get a taste of the history of New Orleans cuisine served up hot at the Story Café, led by PBS Chef Kevin Belton and cookbook author and "Louisiana Eats!" host, Poppy Tooker;
- Take a visceral step inside the soundtrack of the city in a largerthan-life trumpet-shaped listening stations featuring selections of jazz, blues, classical and more;
- Try a hand at virtually piloting a river boat through sharp turns and whirling river currents of the Mississippi River and earn a pilot pin;
- "Zoom in" and see the landscape of the city on a virtual "vue finder" located along side breathtaking real-life views;
- Mix and match costumes with a digital outfitter and leave with a souvenir photo in full regalia;
- Ride an elevator through the history of New Orleans show-casing three centuries of events and personalities in 34 floors

## Minnesota Transportation Museum

#### Osceola, Wisconsin

Enjoy all the sensations of a bygone era by riding the vintage Osceola & St. Croix Valley Railway. Round-trip excursions depart from the historic Soo Line Depot in Osceola, Wisconsin. The 45- to 90-minute trips provide stunning vistas of Bridal Veil Falls, Buttermilk Falls and the Cedar Bend Drawbridge that crosses the beautiful St. Croix River.

Take a ride in a vintage turn-of-the-century railcar, or in an air-conditioned first-class streamliner car. Pizza cars are popular with adults and kids, and periodic brunch, dinner or wine-tasting trains offer adults a truly romantic railway adventure. The seasonal operation runs from May through October.

Special events include fireworks trains, the popular Pumpkin Express at Halloween time and the spectacular beauty of autumn on our Fall Colors trains.

Bus tours are also welcome to visit us at the Minnesota Transportation Museum in Saint Paul, Minnesota. The historic Jackson Street Roundhouse is open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Wednesdays and Saturdays. The building houses a museum of railroad history,

railroad restoration shops, vintage machine shop and blacksmith shop. One of the few remaining operational railroad turntables in the nation is also available. If your group visits on Saturday, a short ride in a vintage caboose through the rail yard will be given.

Whether it is a ride on the romantic Osceola & St. Croix Valley Railway, a visit to the Minnesota Transportation Museum or both, your bus tour patrons will have a memorable experience that they will share with their families and neighbors.

#### Boothbay Railway Village Museum Boothbay, Maine


Step back in time for a peek at Maine and the way life used to be. Nowhere else in New England can you ride the rails behind vintage steam or diesel locomotives, surrounded by historic Maine buildings preserved in a recreated village, and view a superb collection of more than 60 antique automobiles. Spend a

fun-filled day discovering 35 acres of Maine history brought to life.

The Boothbay Railway Village Museum features more than two dozen historic buildings and structures, including Boothbay Town Hall (1847), Freeport Station (1911), Thorndike Station (1871), and Spruce Point Chapel (1927). The Village structures are open for visitors to stroll through and experience real life history. Each building is filled with unique collections, some of which are original to the building.

The Village exhibits surround a four-acre Village Green, offering a scenic place to relax, have a picnic or for children to run around and play. Children can also feed the resident goats, play on the vintage caboose, visit the Schoolhouse swing set, enjoy a game of corn hole on the green, or look for turtles and frogs at the pond.

The extraordinary Model Railroad display is a sight to behold for all ages, with ever growing and intricate detail representing railroading in Maine during the 1950s and '60s housed in a replica of a historic Maine freight station. The display features 600 feet of tracks and

turnouts, both standard and narrow gauge, on 3.5 scale mile main line and a 46x 20 layout.


The Antique Auto Museum features more than 60 vehicles on display, dating from 1902-1962, illustrating technological advances and engineering fetes that helped make cars accessible to the masses. The collection also includes vintage gas pumps, oil cans, service manuals and other automotive


ephemera. Throughout the season a wide variety of special events are hosted on the Village Green, from vintage car shows to family festivals. The Iron Horse Antiques & General Store is located at the museum entrance, featuring heirlooms, handmades, gifts, toys and snacks. The store is seasonal and open


to the public. The museum is located on Route 27 in Boothbay, just 10 minutes from one of Maine's most picturesque Harbor villages, offering endless opportunities for shopping, dining and boating. The museum is open from Father's Day to the third weekend in October.


#### George H.W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum College Station, Texas

Set on 90 acres on the campus of Texas A&M University in College Station, Texas, The George H.W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum reveals the values and events that shaped the 41st presidency. The main galleries

focus on the past 100 years of American and world history. Visitors can follow George Bush's life through childhood, WWII, the oil industry and his years in various prominent

positions of public service, including Congress, the United Nations, the Republican National

Committee, the Central Intelligence Agency and President. In addition to the 20,000 square feet of exhibit space, the grounds outside include statues, a catch-and-release pond, a walking trail, the Barbara Bush Rose Gardens and the Bush Family Gravesite, which is the final resting place of George Bush, Barbara Bush and their daughter Robin.

In late July, Mandela: The Official Exhibition will open in the Ansary Gallery of American History. This exhibit is the new major global exhibition that explores the life of one of the world's most famous freedom fighters and political leaders. The epic story of Nelson Mandela is told in a series of experiential galleries from his rural childhood home through years of turbulent struggle against the apartheid regime, to his eventual vindication and final years as South Africa's first democratically-elected president.

Visitors will learn about why Mandela is still such an important figure, as the exhibit explores his fight for racial equality, his uncanny ability to forgive and his tireless work to unify South Africa. Mandela's values and commitment to making the world a better place are just as vital now as they were during his lifetime. *Mandela: The Official Exhibition*, produced by Round Room Live in partnership with the Royal House of Mandela (RHoM) and RHom Investments, will be on display beginning July 29, 2022, through April 23, 2023.




years of history, from local native tribes to the settlers that followed in the footprints of the Lewis and Clark Expedition.



It features the world's largest Rosary Collection, 1917 Curtiss Bi-Plane, McCord Fishwheel Replica and exhibits dedicated to the local Columbia River Indian Tribes, as well as Russian and Japanese heritage. Feel free to rest your feet in the theaters featuring films about the formation of the gorge, local history and its future. Learn how Skamania County became Washington's first "Sasquatch Refuge," and why thousands of couples would anxiously run to Skamania County to tie the knot, earning it the title "Marriage Mill."

The museum is open seven days a week, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. For more information and admission costs go to columbiagorge.org. If children are in your group, stop by to pick up a children's workbook and crayons (free). Even join in on the search for their very own "Bigfoot."

### American Heritage Museum Stow, Massachusetts

The American Heritage Musuem is the largest and finest museum of armored vehicles in North America. Opened in 2019, the American Heritage Musuem explores America's conflicts begin-

ning with the Revolutionary War to today. You will discover and interact with American heritage though the history, the national effort developing new technologies for the military and the human impact of America's fight to preserve the freedoms all hold dear. The American Heritage Museum is housed in a 67,000+ square-foot building located at the Collings Foundation's head-quarters in Stow, Massachusetts.

The American Heritage Museum features more than 80 tanks, armored vehicles, historic aircraft and very rare major artifacts. During your visit you can see and experience: the Immersive WWI Trench Experience, the German half-track driven by Lee Marvin in the movie *The Dirty Dozen*, a Higgins boat that brough American troops to the shores of Normandy, a German Panther tank facing off with a Soviet T-34/85 tank (both the only ones in North America) and many more. WWII tank and driving programs are also offered along with a spring and summer filled with amazing living history events.

The American Heritage Museum is well suited for bus tours with plenty of on-site parking and knowledgeable and friendly tour guides who make the visit special. cream to scream for and a huge selection of gifts from the great to the goofy.






